

2018 – 2019 Fifth Grade Flag Essay Contest

General Information:

The purpose of The American Legion of Iowa Essay contest is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the United States Flag on the part of elementary-level students. Other objectives of the contest include the ability to gain knowledge of flag etiquette and respect for the flag.

Awards:

Local and District Contest awards, if any, will be the responsibility of the individual Posts and Districts. Each District finalist must be completed in time to be forwarded to Department of Iowa American Legion, 720 Lyon St., Des Moines, Iowa 50309.

Each of the three Department finalists will be recognized in the same manner as other youth champions and the top three winners will be invited to read their winning essay at the Department Convention. First, Second, and Third Place winners will receive \$500, \$300, and \$200, respectively, from The American Legion of Iowa and Iowa Foundation.

Contests:

Local contests will be conducted and judged by the local sponsoring Legion Post, and the winning essay, along with certification form completed, will be forwarded as follows:

- 1. Individual Legion Posts will forward one winning entry to their District Children and Youth Chairman, with signed Participation Application, postmarked by January 2, 2019.
- 2. District entries will be judged by the respective District Children and Youth Chairman, and one District finalist certification and essay, sent to Department Headquarters, postmarked by January 22, 2019 (PLEASE NOTE MID-WINTER FALLS EARLY THIS YEAR).
- 3. Department Children and Youth Committee will judge the nine District entries at Mid-Winter Conference, immediately following the Americanism meeting.

Essay:

The written essay will be no more than 300 words and will be limited to one full page, double-spaced, typewritten, 12-pitch, and must be the original effort of the contestant. The subject will pertain to personal interpretation of what the United States flag represents to the individual, based on facts from the United States Flag Code.

Eligibility:

Participants shall be citizens of or lawful permanent residents of the United States. All contestants must be students enrolled in the

fifth grade in a public, parochial, military, private or state accredited home-school.
