

Static Display Program

The Static Display Program is conducted by the Army Donations Program Office in the Integrated Logistics Support Center of the US Army TACOM Life Cycle Management Command located in Warren, Michigan. This program is conducted in accordance with Title 10 United States Code §2572 as implemented by Army Regulation 700-131. An eligible organization may qualify to



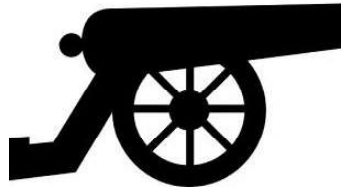
receive a conditionally issued condemned or obsolete Army combat piece of equipment for static display purposes.

Below are the types of organizations authorized by law to qualify for the conditional issue of obsolete, condemned



Army combat equipment for static display:

- Incorporated Museum (operated and maintained for educational purposes only and the charter of which denies it the right to operate for profit);
- Municipal Corporation;
- Museum, Historical Society, or Historical Institution of a State or a Foreign Nation or a non-profit military aviation heritage foundation or association incorporated in a State;
- Veterans' Memorial; and,
- Veterans' Service Organization with a National Headquarters



NOTE: Operational Army equipment is NOT provided under the Army Static Display Program. The active military, National Guard, and/or Reserve are not authorized to participate in the Army Static Display Program. See Army Regulation 870-20: Army Museums, Historical Artifacts, and Art for additional information. The Center of Military History has the mission responsibility for military requests. The Army does NOT sell combat equipment.

The following types of organizations may NOT qualify for the conditional issue of Army equipment: Cemeteries, Schools, Veteran service organizations without a National Headquarters.

Maintenance and Preservation of static displays

Sprucing up your static displays? Follow these tips from the Army Donations Program Office!

Conditionally donated US Army property is issued in an "AS-IS" condition. It is the responsibility of the civilian organization to touch up or to completely repaint the item in order to make it an attractive display.

Most government vehicles are painted with chemical agent resistant coating (CARC). If sandblasting is required on an asset with this coating, use extreme caution. It is strongly recommended the painter(s) wear a breathing apparatus to protect against potential airborne particles of the CARC paint. Please note lacquer will not adhere to CARC coating; therefore, do not use lacquer on the asset.

ARMY/MILITARY GREEN PAINT FORMULA

Sears* is a known commercial resource for paint. The paint formula provided below is made by Sears, although any other manufacturer that makes a color close to the "Army Green" will also work. The Toll Free Number for the Sears Paint Hotline is 1-800-9-PAINTS (724687). This paint lasts approximately five (5) years: Weatherbeater Satin House & Trim, #4988 Tint Base (Gallon). *DISCLAIMER: The Army does not endorse any specific commercial sources concerning the maintenance and preservation of an asset.

The formula is listed below. Please note that the conversion listed in parenthesis must be entered manually by the paint technician.

Colorant	(manually enter)Oz.	1	100 th
8942-YLO	(1.040)	1	4
8943-YOX	(8.330)	8	33
8946-BLK	(2.070)	2	7
8940-WHT	(.560)		56

Organizations are not authorized to paint the Army asset for advertising purposes. Each organization is required to display and maintain the item in such a way that it honors and upholds the image of the United States, our military forces, and the veterans. Post emblems, camouflage patterns,

stars, lettering, numbers, and other appropriate insignia are permissible, as long as the image of the United States Government is not degraded.

Please contact the Army Donations Program Office for clarification if you are unsure of what is permissible.

Ceremonial Rifle Program

The Ceremonial Rifle Program is conducted by the Army Donations Program Office in the Integrated Logistics Support Center of the US Army TACOM Life Cycle Management Command located in Warren, Michigan. This program is conducted in accordance with Title 10 United States Code §4683 as implemented by Army Regulation 700-131.

The types of organizations authorized by law to qualify and conditionally receive Army rifles for ceremonial purposes include: Law Enforcement Agency; Veterans' Service Organization with a National Headquarters; Veterans' Service Organization without a National Headquarters; and, National Cemetery.

The active military, National Guard, and/or Reserve are not authorized to participate in the Army Ceremonial Rifle Program. See Army Regulation 71-32 for additional information. Individuals are not authorized to participate in this program.

The Army does NOT sell rifles!



.30 Caliber Blank with Rosette Crimp

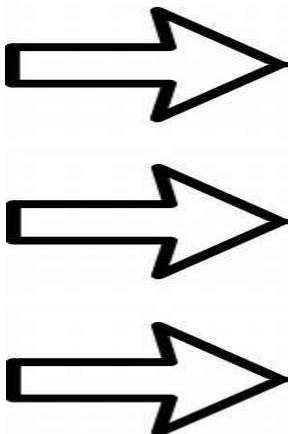
The current design of the .30 caliber blank cartridge incorporates a rosette crimp mouth closure with six crimps.

If the rosette crimp of the blank cartridge does not open during normal firing and cycling it should not be considered a malfunction.



.30 Caliber Blank with Bottle Nose

The bottle nose wad closure design of the .30 caliber blank cartridge is still approved for use and should be considered serviceable.
