Annual Clothing Allowance

Today is a good time to start thinking about submitting your

annual clothing allowance applications. The clothing allowances is a allowance available to veterans who are rated for a service connected condition that requires the use of a wheelchair, or orthopedic appliances. Also, if an individual has a service-connected skin condition that requires medication, which harms the outer clothing you may be entitled

to an annual clothing allowance.

You may also qualify for multiple clothing allowances, if more than one prosthetic appliance and/or medication is used for two separate service-connected disabilities. One example is being service connected for paraplegia and requiring the constant use of a wheelchair.

In order to apply, you must submit a VA Form 10-8678 to the Prosthetic and Sensory Service at your local Department of Veterans Medical Center (VAMC) prior to August 1st of each year. The current annual clothing allowance is \$968.52, which is paid after August 1st. The application is available on the Department of Veterans Affairs website or you may contact your local Prosthetic Department as well

your local PVA Service Officer for assistance.

The applications are collected throughout the year and held until the closing date of August 1st. They are then processed, and Veterans should receive their payments between September 1st and October 31st. Remember this is an annual payment and will only be made during this time frame only. If you are under the reoccurring clothing allowance, then you do not need to reapply for this benefit.

Remember BE THE ONE and Buddy Checks. Call a friend or someone whether they are a veteran or a civilian and see how they are doing. We all can make a difference and we must make the difference. Too many lives are being wasted due to suicide and drugs. We had our buddy when we were in service and we need to continue that in our civilian life.

As I travel around my corner of Northeast lowa and visit any of the 69 posts that make up 4th District, I am asked a similar question again and again. "What is the long-term plan for the American Legion?"

When faced with the declining numbers within posts, every conversation leads back to the fear of posts slowly declining (by as many as 2-3 members a year) with the passing of "seasoned" members of their posts "aging out" through death and declining health. With the difficulty of finding new members to replace those we lose; the time seems inevitable that posts will slowing be a thing of the past. So how do I answer this concern when faced with the question time and time again? This is certainly a national epidemic and not just for the American Legion and certainly not just in small rural towns throughout the state of lowa.

We, as a fixture within our communities, need simply to look closely around us to see who makes up our community. Think beyond our walls of a legion hall, fire station, local bar, or community center where monthly meetings are held and see who makes up the community activities around us. Go where the people are. Go to the sporting events, the high school football games, the county fairs and see who's wearing an "Army" hat or a "Go Air Force" sweatshirt. Veterans stand out by the way they stand, walk, talk, even the haircut they sport. Find that young man or woman who may have joined the military right out of high school (often listed in the local newspapers at Graduation time) and has now moved back to your community to work at the local grocery store or on Mom & Dad's dairy farm.

Keep in mind, they will most likely NOT come knocking on your door as so often I find, they don't consider themselves "real" veterans as "I only served a couple years", or "I'm not interested in belonging to a group of old people who sit around and tell "war stories" all day", or perhaps something happened

during their service time that caused them to leave the military life behind. So It's our job to reach out to them; offer them something they may not even realize they are looking for. I guarantee there are benefits they qualify for that they may not even realize. Benefits and support that we, The American Legion family, can provide.

So always be looking for those individuals around us that are new to your community, find those young or recently retired veterans and start a casual conversation. Get to know them and thank them for their service ... you may be surprised by who is living next to you, just waiting to be invited to belong to something bigger than themselves; something they may be missing from their time in service. An organization designed to look out for them & their families, The American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary.



Jackie Westover – AEF chairman

This year Mother Nature has been especially brutal to lowa from tornadoes, straight winds, to historical flooding. Hard times can fall upon us at any moment. In a brief moment of time, your home, your belongings, and your life as you knew it may be wiped out. Are you prepared for this type of emergency?

The Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) is a national grant assistance program that provides financial assistance to eligible members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have endured a significant financial setback as the result of an act of nature or other personal crisis. It is a grant up to \$3000 to eligible members who received damage to their primary residence, been displaced/evacuated or experienced out of pocket emergency expenses because of mother nature or other personal hardship. Grants will not be granted to pay medical expenses, credit card debt or any other expenses not related to shelter or basic household

To be eligible to apply, membership needs to be up to date and maintained for a minimum of 3 years—2 consecutive years plus the current year. The application needs to be received by the National AEF dept within 6 months of the disaster and documentation will need to also be provided. Only 1 grant per grantee will be awarded in a 12-month period. If you have been impacted, the criteria and application is on the National American Legion







The purpose of The American Legion of Iowa Essay Contest is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the United States Flag on the part of elementary-level students. Other objectives of the contest include the ability to gain knowledge of flag etiquette and respect for the flag.

Awards:

Each of the three Department finalists will be recognized in the same manner as other youth champions and the top three winners will be invited to read their winning essays at the Department Convention. First, Second, and Third Place winners will receive \$500, \$300, and \$200, respectively, from The American Legion of Iowa and the Iowa Foundation.

Contests:

Local contests will be conducted and judged by the local sponsoring Legion Post, and the winning essay, along with the certification form completed, will be forwarded as follows:

- 1. Individual Legion Posts will forward one winning entry (please retain a copy) to their District Children and Youth Chairperson, with a signed Participation Application, postmarked by January 5th of the current program year. If the 5th falls on a weekend, then postmarked by the next business day.
- 2. District entries will be judged by the respective District Children and Youth Chairperson, and sent to Department Headquarters, postmarked by January 22nd of the current program year. If the 22nd falls on a weekend, then postmarked by the next business day.
- 3. Department Children and Youth Committee will judge the nine District entries at Mid-Winter Conference, immediately following the Americanism meeting.

Essay:

The format for the essay is limited to the following: A one (1) page document containing 300 words or less, double-spaced, 12-point font, and the student's own words and effort. The essay is to reflect the student's perspective of what the United States Flag represents to them using facts from the United States Flag Code.

Eligibility:

Participants shall be citizens of or lawful permanent residents of the United States. All contestants must be students enrolled in the fifth grade in a public, parochial, military, private, or state-accredited home school.

Curt, a Paid Up For Life member, is an outstanding representative of veterans and his community.




Districts and Posts need to encourage online renewals and the posts are encouraged to use my legion.org for their membership submissions to save time and money.

As a sign of their dedication, together with the Boys State Delegates, they raised over \$4,000 for the Boys State Endowment, reflecting the commitment to supporting future leaders and growing our program.

Our hosts, the Iowa National Guard, provided top-notch facilities and activities, including the LRC (Leadership Reaction Course), rappel tower, and a static display of equipment. These opportunities gave the delegates valuable lessons in teamwork and leadership while highlighting the Iowa National Guard's role in serving our communities. The week also featured an inspiring Motivational Speaker Series, where life lessons were shared, encouraging the delegates to face future challenges head-on.

This is what Legion Post 45 Historian Harold Blatt, who also attended Boys State as a counselor, told the Manchester Press about his experience joining the 7 delegates sent from his post. "Boys State has a lot of benefits not only to the participants but also to the community," Blatt shared. "The purpose is to develop good citizenship but also leadership skills. After a week, you see so much growth in these young people that is just amazing. They are ready to come back here and do great things."




