NATIONAL COMMANDER'S PIN INCENTIVE PROGRAM

American Legion National Commander James A. LaCoursiere Jr. will award his national commander "Be the One" dog tag coin to any Legionnaire who obtains three new members into The American Legion.

A new member is any eligible person joining for the 2025 membership year who was not a member of The American Legion during the 2024 membership year. Transfers do not count as new members.

Each member listed must be eligible for membership in The American Legion. New Auxiliary members and Sons of The American Legion members do not count toward this incentive. Forward names of Sons of The American Legion members or Auxiliary members to your squadron or unit for use in their respective incentive programs.

Only one coin will be awarded per individual. Upon receipt, national membership staff will confirm the names in the national database and mail the coin directly to the person who earned it.

100% AMERICAN LEGION FAMILY RIBBON

American Legion National Commander James A. LaCoursiere Jr. will award his 100% American Legion Family Ribbon to any American Legion Family that achieves 100 percent membership by the 2025 100% membership target date. For this award, the Legion Family is defined as a post and/or any combination of an Auxiliary unit or Sons squadron. Each must achieve 100% membership to qualify for the award. The department adjutant will transmit information.

NATIONAL COMMANDER'S 103% MEMBERSHIP AWARD

American Legion National Commander James A. LaCoursiere Jr. will award his "Be the One" dog tag coin to any post commander, district commander, county commander, division commander, department commander or membership chairman who achieves 103% of their assigned membership goal for 2025. Coins will be mailed directly to the recipient unless otherwise stated.

POST EXCELLENCE AWARD

To qualify for the American Legion's Post Excellence Award, a post is required to achieve excellence in four areas: membership, submission of the Consolidated Post Report (CPR), attaining a 90% renewal rate, and community activity.

The purpose of this award is membership growth, exposure of American Legion values to the community, and increased visibility of the American Legion Family through service projects. A post achieving this qualification will have had numerous post members involved in planning and achieving these goals. Many posts are already

active in these areas and will qualify without extra effort. Others, however, will need to increase their efforts in one or more areas to qualify for the award.

The standard to be achieved in each area is as follows:

Membership: The post must attain at least 103% of their membership goal. At least one post officer attends district meetings.

Consolidated Post Report: CPRs must be submitted by July 1. The American Legion's federal charter requires the submission of an annual report to Congress on activities for the year. MyLegion.org has made it simple for a post to submit its CPR in a timely manner.

90% Renewal Rate: The post must renew at least 90% of their members that were on the 2023 roster.

Community Activity: The post must conduct an event that connects the local community with The American Legion post. The objective is to open your doors, welcome the community in, and educate them on what The American Legion is all about and how the post is an asset to the community. Posts do not need to have a physical building to accomplish this. This activity can be held in a park, a community center, or anywhere the post can welcome and interact with the local community.

Certification for the award: The district commander responsible for the post will certify a post as having achieved the four specified criteria. The district commander will submit a list of posts meeting the criteria to department headquarters. That list should include the post name, phone number, address and commander's name. If possible, accompany the last two criteria with copies of press releases submitted to the local media about the projects to show that the projects were not only accomplished but that an attempt was made to enhance the image of The American Legion through local media. The copy submitted should include a date and time stamp showing receipt by the media outlet.

The department adjutant will transmit the information.

FLAG REWARDS PROGRAM

- Your Post can receive a 10¢ credit for each dollar spent on the purchase of American Flags from Emblem Sales. This includes purchases made by your Post, as well as by members, friends, neighbors, schools, and businesses that choose to sponsor your Post and buy their flags from The American Legion.
- Your Post can ask potential sponsors to purchase their flags from American Legion Emblem Sales or the Post can buy and re-sell the flags. If a Sponsor purchases an American Flag from Emblem Sales, they will need to request that their purchase benefit their local Post and indicate the Post #. Once a sponsor chooses a local Post, all future purchases will automatically benefit the Post.
- Points earned for the calendar year will be credited to your Post account once a year, by February 1 of the following year. For example, 2024 points earned will be available on February 1, 2025, and may then be used on any future transactions. Your Post will have 11 months, February 1 to December 31, to spend its points, which expire on December 31 each year.
- Posts have taken a copy of the Flag Rewards sign-up to their city councils, schools, county, and state
 officials, giving them the opportunity to purchase US-made flags directly through The American Legion
 Emblem Sales many times at substantial savings from what they were currently paying. The sales result
 in a credit for the local American Legion Post, that could be spent on items from American Legion
 Emblem Sales Honor Guard uniforms, supplies, incentives, awards anything the Post desires.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY FUND

The American Legion National Emergency Fund was established to meet the needs of Posts or an individual member of the Legion family - Legion, Auxiliary, or SAL - in areas stricken by natural disasters. Individuals are eligible to receive grants up to \$3,000 and posts up to \$10,000.

All requests for assistance will be submitted through Department Headquarters on The American Legion National Emergency Fund Grant Application. Should a natural disaster occur in your District, we recommend your District designate one individual to set up a centralized location for members to obtain copies of the grant application.

TAX-EXEMPT STATUS AND IRS FILINGS

- Under the 2006 Pension Protection Act (PPA), a non-church exempt organization's failure to file IRS Form 990 for three consecutive years will result in the revocation of the organization's exempt status.
- All posts are required to file an IRS Form 990 every year.

AMERICAN LEGION OF IOWA FOUNDATION

Incorporated Nov. 29, 1978, as the charitable entity of the Iowa Department of The American Legion, the Foundation was organized as a mechanism for the Legion to provide financial assistance to promote Americanism, youth programs, veterans' rehabilitation, and community service in the state of Iowa.

Since 1979, over \$3 million has been contributed to support veterans' assistance, educational programs, patriotic endeavors, and children and youth programs. The American Legion of Iowa Foundation has accumulated a total permanent endowment fund of over \$2.2 million. Earnings from this endowment are dedicated to supporting programs of veterans' assistance, education, and patriotic endeavors.

THE AMERICAN LEGION BASIC TRAINING

The American Legion's official training program for officers, members, Legion College applicants and those who simply want to expand their knowledge of the nation's largest veterans service organization is now available online.

Already taken the old course? The American Legion Extension Institute has been rewritten, updated, streamlined and enhanced with videos, digital photos, clickable links, a historical timeline and additional features. The program should take less than two hours to complete. It is divided into six sections, with a quiz at the end of each one, followed by a final exam.

BOYS STATE: JUNE 22 – 27, 2025, AT CAMP DODGE

Post is eligible to register for a group hold beginning October 15th.

The American Legion of Iowa Boys State program will be held June 22 – 27, 2025, at Camp Dodge.

Post Adjutants should have received information in the mail regarding the timeline and the process. Post Boys State Chairs or members responsible for the program need to check with their adjutant for that information.

Post Reservations are online. There is a video and step-by-step guide provided online to help. The advantages of CampWise are:

- More post access to information such as delegate contact & registration status.
- Posts are now invoiced rather than having to pay to hold spots, which will reduce the time and resources for refunds. Payment will be taken online through the post portal. This also puts more on the posts to be involved no funds and the delegate does not participate.
- CampWise will be available during regular business hours to assist in the online reservation process.

AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL

- Teams on file were emailed a packet this fall with information to register. Post-contact information will be required to participate. We are striving to increase communication to include posts in everything.
- Registration fees for Senior Teams are \$375 and for Junior Teams \$250.
- The 2025 Department Area Tournament will be April 19-20 and 26-27.
- The 2025 Department State Tournament will be May 3 or 4 (One and Done, One Day).
- Coaches meeting on Saturday of Mid-Winter.
- Anyone 18 years or older volunteering or coaching must pass a background check and abuse training. There are no exceptions to this as it is required by law for this sport.

CONSOLIDATED POST REPORTS

The Consolidated Post Reports (CPR) will be mailed to each Post Adjutant on record in the spring of 2025. The Consolidated Post Report must be returned on the correct annual form to Department Headquarters, or submitted through myLegion.org (preferred), before June 15 to be considered for Department Community Service and Children & Youth Awards. Eligible posts selected will be awarded during the Department Convention. Posts wishing to be considered for Community Service and Children & Youth Awards for Community Service and Children & Youth Awards need to provide a narrative of their activities with their CPR submission. Narratives may be submitted separately if your post's CPR is submitted electronically. Start collecting information now so it is not forgotten.

VETERANS EMPLOYMENT & EDUCATION AWARDS

The National Veterans Employment & Education Commission annually presents several awards to honor employers who hire veterans, disabled veterans, and older workers. Those who help veterans find employment are also recognized.

The awards include:

- Employer of the Year Small Business, Mid-Sized Business and Large Business
- Employer of the Disabled Award
- Employer of Older Workers Award
- Local Veterans Employment Representative of the Year
- Outstanding Disabled Veteran Outreach Program Specialist of the Year
- Outstanding Employment Service Office of the Year
- Michael Guty Homeless Veterans Outreach Award

Nomination forms for each award are available through the Department Headquarters. All entries must be accompanied by an official nomination form with no more than two pages of narrative, along with supporting documents.

The deadline for submittals to the Department Veterans Benefits Committee is **October 15**. It is important that the Post nominations are submitted by this time to ensure that they are considered for the Department Awards

to be delivered at the Department Convention. The Department selects one nominee in each category as its winner and submits the winners for the National awards.

EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR
