Fifth Grade Flag Essay Contest Rules

General Information

The American Legion of Iowa Essay Contest aims to help elementary students develop a deeper understanding and appreciation for the **United States Flag**. The contest also helps students learn flag etiquette and respect. The application can be downloaded from the website: **www.ialegion.org/flag-essay**.

Awards

- **Local and District:** Awards, if any, are the responsibility of the individual post and district.
- **Department (State):** Department finalists will be recognized as other youth champions and invited to read their essays at the Department Convention. The first, second, and third-place winners will also receive **\$500, \$300, and \$200**, respectively, from The American Legion of Iowa and the American Legion of Iowa Foundation.

Contest Rules

Essays are judged in three stages:

1. **Local:** A local American Legion Post will judge essays and forward one winning entry to their District Children and Youth Chairperson. This entry, along with a signed application, must be **postmarked no later than January 5, 2027**.
2. **District:** The District Children and Youth Chairman will judge the entries and forward one winning essay and application to Department Headquarters. This must be **postmarked no later than January 22, 2027**. A list of district chairs is available at the website above.
3. **Department:** The nine district entries will be judged by the Department Children & Youth Committee at the Midwinter Conference.

Note: All sections of the application must be completed and all directions followed to be eligible. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

Essay Format and Eligibility

- **Eligibility:** Contestants must be fifth-grade students enrolled in a public, parochial, military, private, or state home school. They must also be citizens or lawful permanent residents of the United States.
- **Essay Format:**
 - **Length:** One page, 300 words or less.
 - **Formatting:** Double-spaced with 12-point font.
 - **Content:** The essay must be the student's own work, reflect their perspective on what the U.S. Flag represents to them, and use facts from the United States Flag Code.
 - **Title/Name:** The essay must include a title and the student's name, which will not be part of the word count.
